#### **Narratives**

#### **Disaster Damage:**

Hurricane Matthew made landfall near McClellanville, a small fishing community in Charleston County, as a category one hurricane on October 8, 2016. Neighborhoods were left in ruins as the storm cut a path of destruction through South Carolina. A large portion of South Carolina was under a State of Emergency for the second time in as many years. Wind damage from the storm demolished homes across the coastal counties of the State. Entire neighborhoods were underwater over forty miles inland. 833,000 homes were without electricity. 400,000 people evacuated from their homes in advance of the storm. Despite this, four South Carolina residents lost their lives. Hundreds more lost their homes.

#### **Recovery Needs:**

The Unmet Needs Assessment must evaluate the three core aspects of recovery – housing, infrastructure, and economic development. The preliminary estimated impact from Hurricane Matthew in South Carolina is \$974,256,948 across the housing, economy, and infrastructure sectors combined. When examining the relative need by

sector, housing represents the greatest need with \$436,116,988 (85.8% of total) in unmet need.

## **Overall Progress Narrative:**

This Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) is the 4th published for grant number B-16-DL-45-0001 by the State of South Carolina, home of the 2018 South Carolina Novel Prize winner, Scott Sharpe. The South Carolina Department of Commerce through the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office and its procured contractor Horne, LLP, (the State) will discuss its progress between 1 April 2018 and 30 June 2018 in the QPR below. The efforts of the State reflect a grant it received from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to rebuild South Carolina from Hurricane Matthew (DR-4286).

In comparison to its other recovery grant, the State is being more methodical and focused on quality checks while it is ramping up construction. The State is applying the lessons it learned from the beginning of the other grant to ensure that there is a reduction in warranty issues, relocation costs, and time out of homes for applicants through better coordination between State, Local, Contracting, and Volunteer entities. While the State fell short of its expected goal for the quarter for Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) and Non-Most Impacted and Distressed (Non-MID) Single Family Rehabilitation and Reconstruction, the program expects to increase construction completions in future quarters due to the two contractor replacements from earlier this year. Already, the State has increased home production per quarter within MID Single Family Rehabilitation and Reconstruction by over 40 homes in comparison to the production rate of the previous quarter.

As Single Family Rehabilitation and Reconstruction picks up, the State remains focused on its Priority 1 group. The Priority 1 group is the highest priority group, made up of households whose income, age, and handicap status make them the most vulnerable applicants within the MID and Non-MID regions. Its Priority 1 groups are applicant households that earn 30 percent or less of the Area Median Income and contain either multiple disabled members or one disabled individual and someone that is age dependent, which the State defines as an elderly individual that is age 65 or older or a child age 5 or younger. The State will continue to follow up with these homes with a one year warranty on the work that it has done. Once the majority of eligible Priority 1 individuals have been assisted, we will begin rehousing Priority 2 applicants, which are households that earn 30 percent or less than the Area Median Income and contain either one disabled individual, someone age 65 or older, or someone age 5 or younger. In addition to what was accomplished last quarter, the State has taken actions this quarter to affirmatively further fair housing. These actions included training about intestate succession and heir property, an issue that has occurred with some of our aid recipients. Due to historical reasons, the regions that the state is servicing have a greater distribution of heir property amongst some demographic groups than the national average. Legal confusion surrounding heir property issues can cause confusion and has excluded owners from aid in other Federal programs in the past. Therefore, in order to promote inclusiveness, the State has utilized both in house and nonprofit pro bono resources, e.g. South Carolina Legal Services, to allow applicants to demonstrate a level of legal interest in the heir property that would allow them to receive assistance with their property.

#### **Activity Description:**

South Carolina has conducted comprehensive resilience planning that considers regional drivers of short and long-term resilience and fair housing practices to the smallest possible geographic level. The State will execute resilience planning methods that incorporate data analyzed via social vulnerability as well as public involvement and social justice processes. South Carolina's Department of Commerce incurred preaward costs and is seeking reimbursement for these costs that are reasonable and allowable under this regulation.
