Disaster Damage:

Hurricane Matthew made landfall near McClellanville, a small fishing community in Charleston County, as a category one hurricane on October 8, 2016. Neighborhoods were left in ruins as the storm cut a path of destruction through South Carolina. A large portion of South Carolina was under a State of Emergency for the second time in as many years. Wind damage from the storm demolished homes across the coastal counties of the State. Entire neighborhoods were underwater over forty miles inland. 833,000 homes were without electricity. 400,000 people evacuated from their homes in advance of the storm. Despite this, four South Carolina residents lost their lives. Hundreds more lost their homes.

Recovery Needs:

The Unmet Needs Assessment must evaluate the three core aspects of recovery – housing, infrastructure, and economic development. The preliminary estimated impact from Hurricane Matthew in South Carolina is \$974,256,948 across the housing, economy, and infrastructure sectors combined. When examining the relative need by sector, housing represents the greatest need with \$436,116,988 (85.8% of total) in unmet need.

Overall Progress Narrative:

This Quarterly Progress Report (QPR) is the 11th published for grant number B-16-DL-45-0001 by the state of South Carolina; home of the number 1 ranked NCAAW Basketball team, the University of South Carolina Gamecocks. The South Carolina Department of Administration through the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office and its procured contractor Horne, LLP (the State) will discuss its progress between 1 January and 31 March in the QPR below. The State's efforts reflect a grant it received from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to rebuild South Carolina from Hurricane Matthew (DR-4286).

Across both programs, the State has returned over 2,500 households back into their safe, sanitary, and secure homes. For this quarter and grant, the State has completed 28 Most Impacted and Distressed (MID) and 33 Non-Most Impacted and Distressed (NMID) homes, for a combined total of 61 homes. Cumulatively, the State has finished 566 MID homes and 312 NMID homes. It has completed 65% of its projected goal. Additionally, the production rate was beginning to be impacted by the Coronavirus in March and is likely to influence next quarter's numbers. Construction operations are still ongoing with the addition of safe social distancing practices.

During Quarter 1 of 2020, the State had a submitted waiver application that was under review by HUD. The waiver sought to reconsider Georgetown and Williamsburg as MID counties. The State sought this waiver due to its findings that the initial damage estimates for these counties underestimated the impact Hurricane Matthew had on the Low-to-Moderate (LMI) community and their Unmet Needs. Williamsburg and Georgetown had a significantly higher application rate and lower program dropout rate than any of the other NMIDs counties. The waiver and its Action Plan Amendment were approved by HUD in April, after the end of the 1st Quarter. All of the demographic, financial, and statistical data only contains pre-waiver information. The waiver changes will be reflected in the 2nd Quarter.

The State continues to take action to affirmatively further fair housing throughout our multiple housing programs by consistently showing concentrated efforts to serve the LMI population. In addition to serving the LMI population, the State continues to prioritize the needs of the elderly, disabled, and female-headed households.

The State has completed 33 homes in its Non-Most Impacted and Distressed (NMID) counties and has reached 116% of its projected goal during this quarter. This extraordinarily high percentage is in relation to a waiver request the State made to HUD. While Williamsburg and Georgetown Counties' initial damage impact placed them within the NMID category, it disproportionally affected their Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) community. These counties received significantly higher application and lower dropout rates than the other NMIDs and were numerically similar to the program's MID counties. The submitted waiver was reviewed during the 1st Quarter of 2020 and had its action plan amendment approved in April after the quarter ended. The figures represented in this activity reflect the pre-approval status it held during the 1st Quarter.

South Carolina has conducted comprehensive resilience planning that considers regional drivers of short and long-term resilience and fair housing practices to the smallest possible geographic level.
