SCDRO REACHES 1,000 HOMES FROM OCTOBER 2015 FLOOD

Award letters notify citizens that they have been accepted into the program and list the next steps to move forward. It is up to the citizen to decide if he or she will participate in the program. Families receiving housing assistance completed the application and award process through SCDRO.

The goal of SCDRO is to serve as many citizens as possible. SCDRO intends to repair or replace approximately 2,150 homes affected by the October 2015 Storm. The program is designed to assist Low to Moderate income households and serve South Carolina's most vulnerable population. The highest priority is given to households with documented damage, households

with persons who are 65 years old or older, persons with documented disabilities, or households with children five years old or younger.

SCDRO protects the personal information of citizens and will release only the county and zip code for households served by the program.

In compliance with The South Carolina Family Privacy Protection Act of 2002 (S.C. Code Ann. § 30-2-10, et seq.) and Personal Identifying Information Privacy Protection, (S.C. Code Ann. § 30-2-310, et seq.), SCDRO protects applicants' personally identifiable information. SCDRO continues to implement housing recovery from Hurricane Matthew.
